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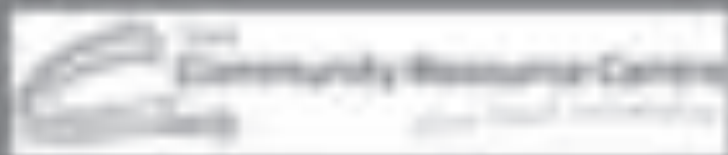

# YORK SHOW CAKE RECIPE 2023

## Lumberjack Cake

Cooking time 1 hr, 10 mins. plus

### Ingredients:

2 apples, large, peeled, cored, finely chopped  
1 cup dates, chopped  
1tsp bicarbonate of soda  
1 cup boiling water  
125g soft butter  
1 tsp vanilla essence  
1 cup caster sugar  
1 egg  
1½ cups plain flour



### Topping

#### 50 g butter

½ cup brown sugar  
½ cup milk  
⅔ cup shredded coconut

### Method:

Grease and line a deep 20cm square cake pan.  
Combine apples, dates and bicarbonate of soda in a bowl.  
Add water and leave for 10 minutes.  
Beat butter, sugar, vanilla and egg until light and fluffy.  
Add butter to apple mixture and fold in flour.  
Pour into prepared pan and bake in a moderate oven for 50 minutes.

### Topping:

Combine ingredients in a saucepan and stir until butter melts and sugar dissolves.  
Remove the cake from the oven and carefully spoon topping mixture over the cake.  
Return to the oven and bake for a further 20 minutes.  
Stand cake for 5 minutes before turning on to a wire rack to cool.

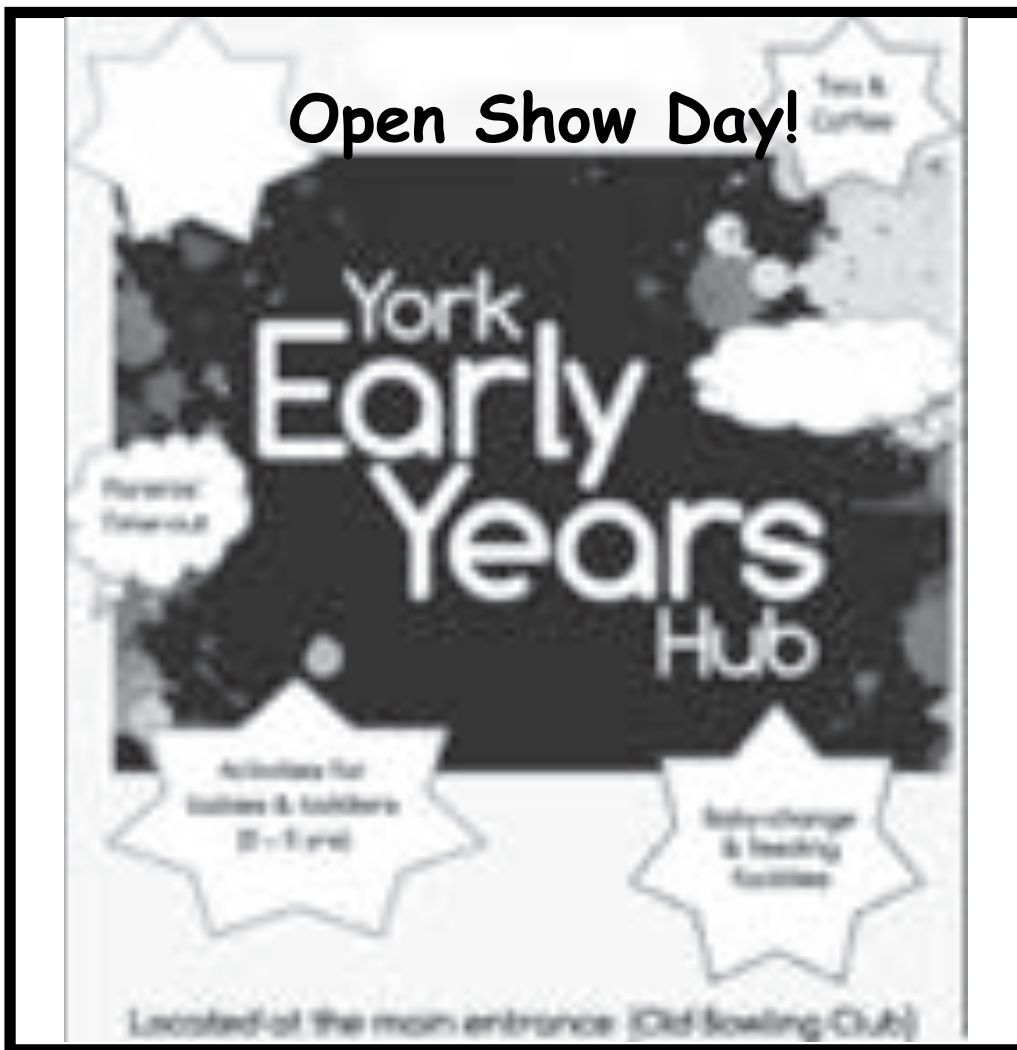

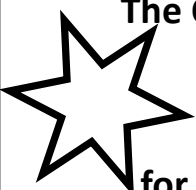

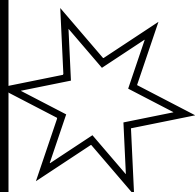
